The *Mountaineer Phi Psi* was first published in 1943, with **Harlan Selby '18** serving as editor. Over the last 79-years, our newsletter has had but four editors, as Harlan was the scribe for 29 of those years. **Louis Corson '34** carried the torch from 1972-1982, before handing off the pen to **David Woodrum '61**. In the Spring of 1992, Woodrum passed the editor's quill to me to carry on as the editor of our chapter's newsletter. Almost exactly 30-years ago!

The longevity, heritage, and pride this chapter has presented to those of us that have pledged can always be linked back with our past, and in so doing, to celebrate the lives and accomplishments of our brethren. I wrote in the June 1992 issue of *Mountaineer Phi Psi* (my first published edition) that this newsletter is the 'glue that continues to hold our giant circle together'. It certainly was true back in 1943 whenever Harlan noted: "there are 143 members of the chapter in the armed forces, which is more than 33% of the living membership". With brothers serving our country across the globe, it was our newsletter that kept them 'in touch' until their return to Morgantown. To this day, our Memorial Chapel, (dedicated in 1951) stands as a beacon 'on the hill' and houses the many plagues and remembrances of those who sacrificed their life...for our freedom. This chapel is also the place where so many of you reading this newsletter started your Phi Psi journey...during your initiation.

As we now embark upon our current campaign: **Live Ever. Die Never. A Stronger Tomorrow**, I am reminded of the strong bond so many of us, regardless of when we pledged, have formed over many years. I remind the undergrads all the time, while your fraternity time together in Morgantown is short ...it is but the beginning of when lifetime bonds are forged. Nothing I love more than "slipping the grip" and putting those three dots after my name in communications with brothers. 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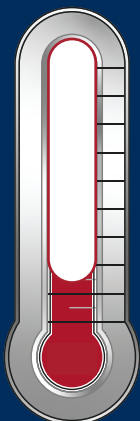

A GLANCE BACK

With Kent Muscaro '81

They say the bend in the road is not the end of the road unless you refuse to take the turn. For **Kent Muscaro '81**, this message rings loud and clear as he has faced not one, but several "bends" on his road to becoming the Director of Finance at Walt Disney World. Much like the road has its bends, success is not linear either - so, where did Kent begin?

In 1980 Brother Muscaro was a chemistry student at West Virginia, looking to become a pharmacist because he "was told" to be one by someone along the way. Without a clear sense of purpose behind him, this son of a welder and loving mother went from chasing a degree - something neither of his parents had - to falling apart. Looking back, Kent thinks he was just "immature and not disciplined" with "a lot of misaligned priorities." A boiling point was reached after nearly 4 years of struggling in school, before the dean essentially advised Kent to change paths altogether.

"Ouch" is how Kent put it.

Working-man-blues erupted as Kent was now out of school, working minimum wage jobs while juggling the part-time gig of trying to "figure out where [he] was supposed to be." If his 20s weren't frustrating enough, he was soon seeing fraternity Brothers (he once considered himself equal to) buying cars and getting married; Meanwhile, for Kent, "pizza and a pitcher of beer on a Friday night was 'living it up.'"

Enough was enough as Muscaro eventually drew a line in the sand, deciding to go back to school for accounting. A novel idea, however, Kent's grades weren't in an ideal state for this comeback ... yet. Kent took the path less traveled by attending a community college to rewrite his life's story one letter grade at a time. It wasn't all sunshine and rainbows, but Kent eventually got his accounting degree after 8 years of adversity.

Things seemed to have taken off from there, as Kent got a chance in the financial career field at Deloitte from a fellow West Virginia alumni. From there, Muscaro got his CPA while working full-time before eventually landing a job with Disney.

As the current Director of Finance for Walt Disney World, Kent oversees finances for Disney parks, entertainment, and more. This step forward brought several more with it, as Muscaro soon met his wife, Kelly, through their work. "The day we were married, West Virginia upset Cincinnati in the NCAA tournament" Kent shares, adding how he remembers that game every year on their anniversary.

It took a few years of hard work and soul searching, but after refusing to give up on himself time and time again, Muscaro embodies perseverance, discipline, and achievement on almost every level of life. However, much like how we can't overlook how Rome was not built in a day, we must not forget the trials and tribulations that make us who we are.

While it's hard to see what once was these days, Kent's humble beginnings are even more admirable with time. Since starting with Disney and getting married, he has obtained an MBA from Duke University and now has 6 children of his own. For someone who used to live for a cheap drink and slice of pizza, a new pie in the sky has surely appeared.

HOUSE CORP UPDATE

Greetings Brothers,

As you read this, another annual cycle in the life of West Virginia Alpha will be starting in Morgantown at 780 Spruce Street. For the past ten months, the House Corp (HC) has been engaged in targeted renovations, improvements and repairs to the James Cochran House and the Goose House. In excess of 105 undergrad members still live in or use these properties daily as the homebase of the fraternity. The annual wear and tear are substantial. A full house (meaning 40+/- residents in 780 Spruce) allows the HC financial leeway to re-invest money in our properties. We are completing some of the most substantial upgrades in nearly a decade. On your next visit, you will see a transformation in the interior House lighting...every fixture was replaced with modern LED lights. This investment will pay for itself in lower utility costs and elimination of buying florescent bulbs / tube replacements. Ongoing now is the removal and replacement of most of the basement laminate flooring with a durable concrete finish intended to last for years. Widow replacements and

upgrades as needed and other bathroom repairs have been completed. The Goose House, which has 5 members residing for the next school year, received bathrooms and laundry room renovations, together with new lighting in some areas.

The entire property received a comprehensive treescape removal and trimming which had not happened in my memory. Through a combination of savings, contributions and borrowing, in excess of \$125,000 was expended on this effort to preserve and maintain our fraternity home and property. More is needed. Our wish list includes a critical re-roofing of the front portico, repainting the Chapel exterior, completing the basement flooring, new cabinets and countertops for the kitchen. I acknowledge local contractor Dave Daniels who has been spear heading the effort in a balancing act of available resources against greatest need.

Nevertheless, the coming year presents challenges. If you graduated more than 5 years ago, you cannot fully appreciate the changes in the Morgantown apartment housing markets since then. Our friends at WVU have not finally settled

on the freshman rush formula. These and other factors affect how many house residents we will have in one or two years. Fortunately, Phi Kappa Phi has met the challenge that so many other fraternities have failed. WV Alpha is currently the most successful Greek organization in Morgantown, and as the Arista Cup winner is clearly setting the standard other chapters seek to emulate. The undergrads are well led by GP Luke Erny '20 and our House Manager **Cole Amos '18**. I want to express my appreciation to a few of the volunteers who carry on that essential tradition of giving service back to the fraternity: **Gary Waters '74, Chilton Wise '70, Charlie Hageboeck '17 and Zack Mendelson '79**.

Hope to see a lot of you in Indianapolis later this month for the 2022 Grand Arch Council, if not also at Heinz Field on September 1 to BEAT THE HELL OUT OF PITT!
