In high school, Yoc was never afraid to be himself and his unique gifts. While most 6'6" tall guys were working on their basketball hook shot, Yoc pursued hockey (which made him 6'8" on skates!) where he instantly became an enforcer on the ice. He also played varsity baseball, and of course pitched; thus giving him an additional 10" height advantage on the mound, which added to his already intimidating presence. Never afraid to leverage his unique strengths combined with a rock-solid heart, Yoc has always been a consistent, towering influence amongst family, friends and brothers dating back to his teenage years some 50-years ago. Thank you, Yoc, for all that you are and continue to be.

Pledge Brother, Ken Waldron '78

During the 1970's, many traveled 77-miles south on I-79, from Pittsburgh to Morgantown to attend WVU. In the fall of 1977, **John "Yoc" Yochum '78** made that short trek to cast his lot with the Mighty Mountaineers. Upon arrival in Morgantown, Yoc settled into dorm life at Dadisman Hall on the downtown campus.

He noted many of his friends and classmates from Upper St Clair High School, including **Ken Waldren '78** and **John "H" Christ '79**, who also made their way to WVU. "If you wanted to get away from home without traveling too far, not to mention tuition was affordable, then WVU was an easy choice," noted Yoc.

Brother H shared: "Yoc always wore that stupid LA Dodgers batting helmet, and there always was an issue with his car. One time, we were driving back to WVU (from Pitts), and the radiator hose in his van broke and sprayed scalding hot water all over me while sitting in the passenger seat."

He rushed second semester to allow himself to settle into college life. Once he pledged, he became an integral part of the chapter. Particularly the *Leukemia Radiothon*, started in 1976, in memory of **C.B. Shingleton II '75**. Over several years, WV Alpha raised over \$50,000 for the Leukemia Society.

Having played hockey since the age of eight, Yoc played four years during high school, and 'tried out' and made the WVU Club Team his junior year. With no scholarship money in play, and an immense time constraint...Yoc backed out of hockey after one game. But his passion never faded.

In 1983, while working in Houston, TX, Yoc met the love of his life, Lori. They married in 1986 in her hometown of Milwaukee, WI. Thirty-eight years later, they are the proud parents of two sons: Craig (age 31), who is a police officer in Jupiter, FL and Brett (age 28), who is a fireman in West Palm Beach, FL. Yoc & Lori reside in Palm City, FL.

In terms of work life, Yoc has spent the better part of his career working for national/global companies in the security service solutions. Presently, he is Vice President National Account Sales/Operations for U.S. Security Associates.

In terms of family, Craig was the consummate over-achiever, and by the time he enrolled at Florida State University (FSU) for his freshman year, he had already earned enough credit hours (via dual-enrollment in Criminal Justice during high school) to qualify as a junior. Life at FSU was short-lived, and after

one year Craig returned to attend the Police Academy at Indian River State College. He joined the police force in 2016. He permanently works the night shift, which he enjoys: working 4 On/4 Off. When I asked his "memorable moment" to date as respects his job, he noted:

In 2017 at 3:00 AM, Craig responded to a two vehicle crash, involving an ambulance. Both paramedics died, and the driver of the other vehicle was a drunk driver. He decided at that moment he would FOREVER have a "zero tolerance" for drunk drivers.

In 2018 Craig was named Police Officer of Year for the City of Jupiter. He is engaged (Ronnie) to be married in November 2024.

Brett had a bit more circuitous path, as he pursued his love of hockey and transferred to a high school in Fort Myers for two years, followed by a year in New Brunswick, Canada (2015). In 2016 he traveled back to Florida and enrolled at Florida Gulf Coast University. During his junior/senior years, the Division II School won the College Hockey National Championship.

In 2019 following graduation, Brett attended the Fire Academy. As the State of Florida requires 'paid firefighters' to have their EMT Certification, this part of the journey became problematic as Covid set-in. By 2021 with all certification complete, he became a Fireman in West Palm Beach, FL. When I asked his "memorable moment" to date as respects his job, he noted:

In 2023, his shift was recognized for the "Call of the Year" related to a one car accident that involved extricating the victim from the vehicle, while saving their life.

Brett is also engaged (Olivia) and will be married in August 2024. The hockey gene remains within all the Yochum Boys as they still love to spend time on the ice together!

Dear Brothers,

Approximately five years ago, a group of dedicated West Virginia Alpha alumni set out to transform and improve the Chapter following our recolonization. They recognized that the University and Greek environment we all knew had changed. To excel and attract the best and brightest to the Chapter, we needed to change our "business model."

We decided West Virginia Alpha needed to require minimum GPAs for pledges and actives, increase the focus on recruiting West Virginia natives or those with connections to West Virginia through alums and family, reconnect with our alumni base, and make ourselves the most attractive option for the highest quality men on campus interested in Greek life. How do you do that? Well, one way is to make sure you have the best facilities and house on campus, be selective, and offer scholarships and leadership training opportunities while at the same time adhering to and never losing sight of the history, values, and traditions that make Phi Kappa Psi and West Virginia Alpha special. And that is what we did.

The Live Ever, Die Never campaign was created recognizing the cold fact that it takes money to accomplish these goals. We set a fundraising goal of \$2.25 million, to be divided between two professionally managed funds.

- 1. \$1M to maintain, support, and improve the Sarah B. Cochran chapter house.

THE STORY OF THE PITT GOAL POST HEIST

HONORING THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE '74 PLEDGE CLASS

Circa 1973, West Virginia Alpha only had a few Morgantown active members (aka townies). In August of that year, their two active brothers, Jim and Dave, who decided it would be helpful to invite a few of the Morgantown High School graduates and would-be incoming freshmen, to visit the frat house to 'wet their appetite' about future Greek life.

After visiting the library and living room, the group retreated to the basement for a quick tour, followed by consumption of a favorite meal of an 18-year old--beer/pizza. [Editor's Note-legal drinking alcohol in those days was age-18].

As they toured the basement, the boy's noted several of the old goal post remnants hanging from the rafters. Coincidentally enough, the (Pitt) sports segment appeared on TV, with an interview of Johnny Majors promoting the upcoming season. Of course, this segment also highlighted Tony Dorsett.

Before long, a chant of Goal Post...Goal Post... could be heard a block away. With emotions running at a high-octane level, a station wagon was loaded up and headed north on I-79. The cast of characters in the car included two brothers, and several future brothers. They arrived in Oakland (Pitt Campus) ~2:00 AM. The group had to first scale a steep wall. Then climb a fence which put them on top of a concession stand. After a mere 8ft jump, access to the stadium was achieved.

Some stayed on top of the concession as a "look out party", while the others made their way to the field. They were able to rock the goal post 'back n forth' before it finally gave way. After securing one of the uprights, it was carried up the 66-steps and handed off to the group on the concession roof, who dropped the prized position over the fence, and then loaded it into the wagon. As the upright was much longer than the car, it extended from the rear window through the front passenger window.

In their haste to escape, it was realized the group left behind one of the brothers. He hid in the bushes for several minutes... with thoughts of spending the night in the Allegheny County Jail...as local police were now surveying the outside of the stadium. But lo and behold, the loyal band came back

to retrieve their missing comrad. As the sun rose the next day, the group signed their prize possession and hung it from the basement rafters. It is worth mentioning that evening as the (TV) station showed Pitt's practice, it was noted that all kicking drills had to be done at just one end of the field.

The few months later, Jim Lorenze, Gary Waters, Junior Taylor, Dave Pill, Dick Ratcliff, Jeff Tenant, and Sky King all became members of WV Alpha in spite of (or perhaps because of) their loyal actions. The only thing better than beating the 'Hell out of Pitt'...is stealing their goal post.

And now, as Paul Harvey would say, you know the rest of the story!

Congratulations to all of the 1974 initiated Brother's as they celebrate their 50th Anniversary in Phi Psi. They will be recognized at our Founder's Day Event, Sunday, October 20th @ The Erickson Alumni Center. See link in this newsletter to register for this event.
